

DOCTRINE OF FEAR

May, 1981

- I. Fear as a mental attitude sin (Gen. 19:30 “Lot and his two daughters left Zoar and settled in the mountains, for he was afraid to stay in Zoar. He and his two daughters lived in a cave.”; Gen. 26:7 “When the men of that place asked him about his wife, he said, ‘she is my sister.’ For he was afraid to say ‘my wife,’ thinking, ‘the men of this place might kill me on account of Rebekah, because she is beautiful.” Gen. 32:7 “Then Jacob was greatly afraid and distressed; and he divided the people who were with him, and the flocks and herds and the camels, into two companies.”
 - A. It is a characteristic of spiritual death (Gen. 3:10 “He answered, ‘I have heard You in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked,”; Rom. 8:15 “For you have not received a spirit of slavery leading to fear again, but you have received a spirit of adoption as sons by which we cry out, ‘Abba, Father.’”; Heb. 2:15 “and might free those who through fear of death were subject to slaver all their lives.”
 - B. It is not to control the believer (Ex. 20:20 “Moses said to the people, ‘Do not be afraid, for God has come in order to test you, and in order that the fear of Him may remain with you, so that you may not sin.”; Deut. 7:18 “you shall not be afraid of them, you shall remember what Yahweh your God did to Pharaoh and to all Egypt’ (Deut. 20:3).
 - C. Believers are told not to fear (Gen. 15:1; 21:17; 26:24; 1Pet. 3:14 quoted from Isa. 8:12 and applied to hostile negative husbands).
- II. Things the believer is not to fear:
 - A. Living grace provision (Mt.10:31)
 - B. Tomorrow (Matt. 6:34)
 - C. Persecution (Mt.10:26,28; Lk.12:5,7,32; Heb.13:6; Rev.2:10)
 - D. Intimidation of human viewpoint (Gal.2:12)
 - E. Sudden danger (Prov.3:25 ,26)
 - F. War, depression, verbal maligning (Job.5:17-24; ; Ps.27:3; Isa 51:7; Lk.21:9).
 - G. Death (Ps.23:4; Matt. 10:28)
 - H. Retaliation (Matt. 12:41; Jn. 19:28; 20:19)
 - I. Things in the night and in the day (Ps. 91:5).
 - J. Bad news (Ps. 112:7).
- III. The expression "fear of the Lord" constitutes sanctified fear.
 - A. Positive volition to BD (Prov.1:7, 29; 9:1; 15:33; Acts 10:35)
 - B. Application of BD (Ps.112:1; 119:63).
- IV. Characteristics of the "fear of the Lord." (or how can you evaluate yourself or others despite the rhetoric).
 - A. "Clean" based on intellectual honesty (Ps.19:9)
 - B. It is the first principle of wisdom (Prov.1:7).
 - C. Confidence (Prov.14:26)
 - D. Avoidance of evil (Job 28:28; Prov.3:7).
 - E. Prospering of negative volition (Prov.23:17ff).
 - F. Contentment Prov.15:16)

- V. Some blessings associated with the fear of the Lord, Ps.115:13.
A. Long life (Prov.10:27; 14:27)
B. Material prosperity (Prov.22:4)
C. Deliverance (Ps.34:47; 25:12-15; 33:18-22; 34:7)
D. Desires of the heart (Ps.145:19)
- VI. Inner peace and faith-rest is the antidote to fear (Jn. 14:27; 16:13; Phil 4:6; 1Pet. 5:7).
- VII. Love (FHs) casts out fear “There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves punishment, and the one who fears is not perfected in love.”)
- VIII. Legitimate or sanctified objects of fear.
A. God (Eccl.12:13,14).
B. Rulers (Prov.24:21; 1Pet.2:17,18).
C. Failure to attain the crown (Phil.2:12).

Jn. 14:1 “Do not let your heart be troubled; believe in God, believe also in Me.”

Jn. 14:27 “Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you; not as the world do I give it to you. Let not your heart be troubled, not let it be fearful.”

Jn. 16:13 “These things I have spoken to you, so that in Me you might have peace. In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world.”
